Report on the Closing Function of the Diamond Jubilee Celebration of the College of Teacher Education (PGT) Shillong

The College of Teacher Education (PGT) Shillong celebrated its Diamond Jubilee with a closing ceremony held on October 22, 2024. The event commenced at 11:30 AM and featured a series of significant activities aimed at honoring the institution's legacy and achievements over the past sixty years.

The ceremony began with the felicitation of the Chief Guest and special guests. Although Shri. Rakkam A. Sangma, Minister of Education, Government of Meghalaya, was unable to attend, Smti.
